Cuba's First Commerce Convention Begins Sessions



Havana, May 15 (RHC)-- Cuba's First Commerce Convention, Cuba-2017, opened sessions Monday, at Havana's Convention Center with the participation of more than 500 delegates and guests from 10 nations.

During the event, which runs through May 19th, researchers, executives, specialists and technical staff in general will exchange and discuss the role of trade and services in the country's economic development.
