

Work of Cuban Women's Organization Highlighted in Angola



Luanda, August 31 (RHC-Granma)-- Cuban collaborators in Angola highlighted the role of the Federation of Cuban Women (FMC) in its efforts to promote the well being of women and their families.

Activities to celebrate the organization's 57th anniversary included encounters with FMC members, talks and music performances; during which participants highlighted the efforts of the historic leader of the Cuban Revolution Fidel Castro, and the organization's founding President, Vilma Espín, to promote gender equality ever since the institution was created on August 23, 1960.
