

Chile Prioritizes Integration in LatAm

Santiago, April 11, (RHC), -- Chile is giving priority to Latin American integration through a variety of recently forged alliances and agencies, a government spokesman said on Thursday.

The integration bears global significance as it could "best resolve the conflicts that can arise in different parts of the planet," spokesman, Alvaro Elizalde, told a gathering of foreign correspondents in the capital Santiago. As for its ties with Asia-Pacific, the biggest buyer of Chile's exports, Elizalde said the new government headed by President Michelle Bachelet plans to make them strong but flexible.

Chile's biggest exports go to the Asia-Pacific, but that doesn't hinder the integration process in Latin America, he said.

"A coordinated Latin America carries greater weight in the world and we are going to continue with a policy of integration in that area," he added.
