

At least 14 former FARC rebels killed in fighting with Colombian army



At least 14 former FARC rebels killed in fighting with Colombian army

Bogota, April 19 (RHC)-- At least 14 former FARC rebels and one Colombian soldier have been killed in combat between guerrillas and the military, army sources said on Saturday.

Members of the Carlos Patino Front - founded by former Revolutionary Armed Forces of Colombia (FARC) rebels who reject a 2016 peace deal - were killed in the confrontations in Argelia, Cauca province, two military sources told Reuters.

The rebels removed the bodies of their fighters, General Eduardo Enrique Zapateiro, the head of the army, said on Twitter. Zapateiro mentioned just 10 rebel deaths. In addition to the soldier who was killed, seven others were wounded, Zapateiro said, after the unit was "attacked indiscriminately with explosive artifacts."

One rebel surrendered to Colombian troops, he added, and the army seized a machine gun, among other weapons.

Government officials and the armed forces estimate there are some 2,500 FARC dissidents throughout the country. The dissidents refuse to adhere to a peace accord that ended the FARC's part in Colombia's armed conflict, which has left 260,000 dead and millions displaced.
