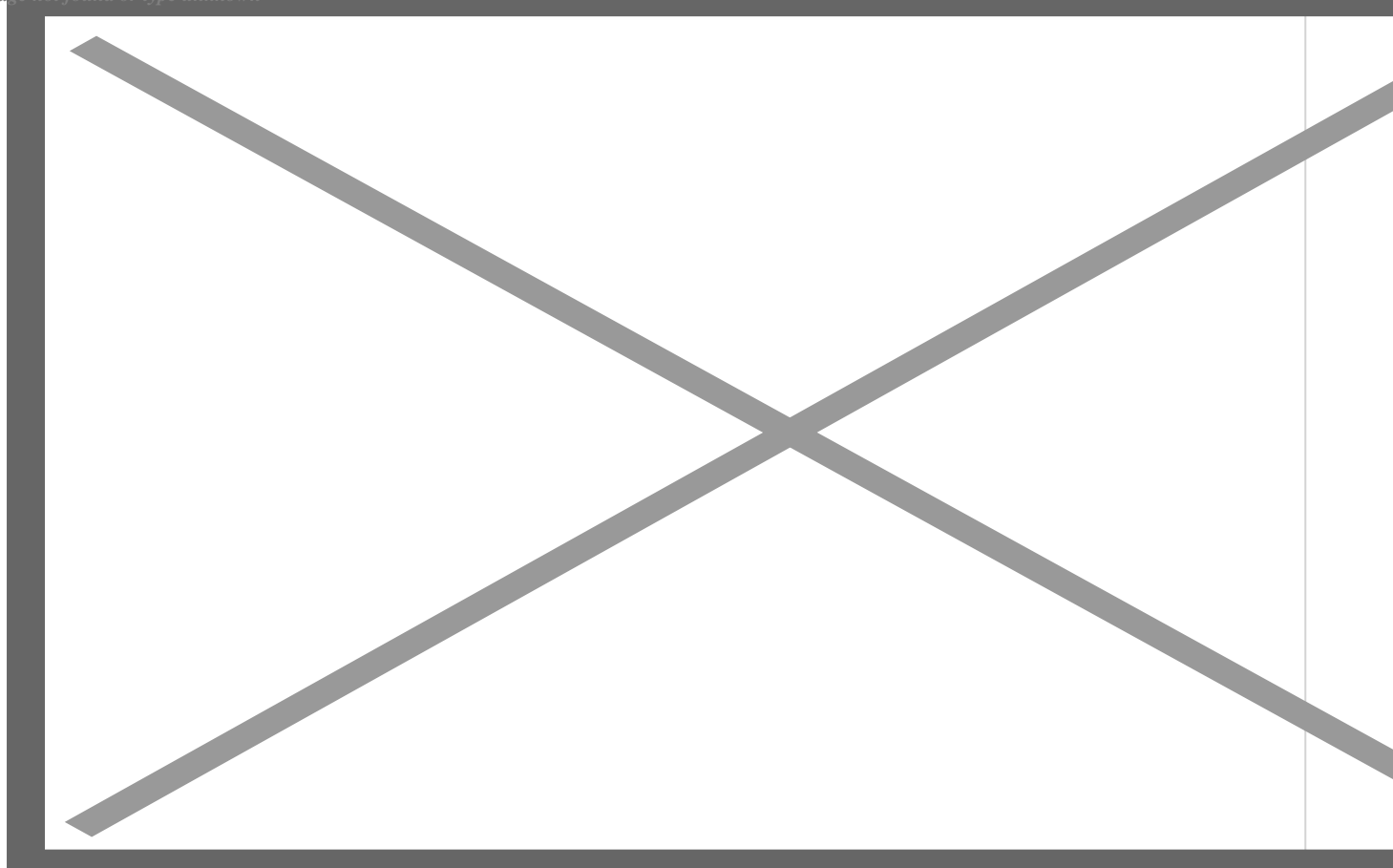


Guyana's president calls out disproportionate effects of climate crisis on small island nations
