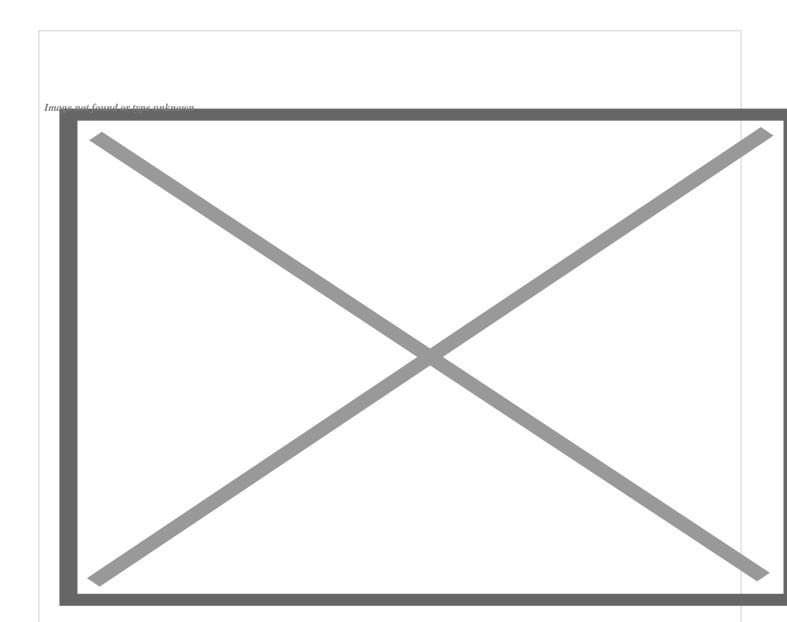
## WHO to decide whether to extend global COVID emergency

Geneva, January 13 (RHC)-- Global COVID-19 cases reached a record high last week, according to the World Health Organization (WHO), with 15 million people testing positive for the coronavirus in the seven days to January 9th.

The figure marks a 55 percent increase from the previous seven days, WHO Director-General Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus said on Wednesday, adding that the "huge spike" was being driven by the

## Omicron variant.

While the highly infectious strain causes less severe disease than the Delta variant, Tedros says the Omicron remains a "dangerous virus", particularly for those who are not vaccinated.

The WHO chief's comments came as Dutch Foreign Minister Wopke Hokestra announced he had tested positive for COVID-19 and teachers in France launched a strike over the government's "chaotic" virus strategy for schools.
