

Los Angeles City Council moves to end oil and gas drilling

The Los Angeles City Council has voted to prohibit new oil and gas wells and phase out existing wells within city limits. The measure also creates a program to help oil and gas workers transition to jobs in other industries.

Los Angeles, January 28 (RHC)-- The Los Angeles City Council has voted to prohibit new oil and gas wells and phase out existing wells within city limits. The measure also creates a program to help oil and gas workers transition to jobs in other industries.

Council President Nury Martinez spoke ahead of the unanimous vote, saying: "For far too long neighborhood drilling has disproportionately affected the health of our low-income communities of color."

From freeways to power plants, our frontline communities bear the brunt of pollution and climate impacts.”

A 2021 study by University of Southern California researchers found residents of majority-Black and Latinx communities in South Los Angeles who live near oil and gas sites have lower lung function, which may contribute to environmental health disparities.
