In a game marked by parity between both teams, a jit to center field by the ninth man in the Cocodrilos' lineup, Yoisnel Camejo, broke the three-way tie at the end of the eighth inning by bringing two men home.

Camejo, who drove in three of Matanzas' five runs, commented that baseball is very big and you never know what can happen, so you need a lot of concentration, an element that was key in his performance during the day.

According to the Crocodile outfielder, this game was one of the most spectacular moments he has experienced in his young career in the world of balls and strikes and he assured that he is ready to continue his contribution to the Reds' cause in this post-season.

On the other hand, in an attractive duel and with only two hits, the Leones de Industriales beat the monarch Granma 1-0, stopped an adverse streak of three defeats and are still breathing in the quarterfinals of the LXI National Baseball Series.

Meanwhile, another two-sided win took place at the Jose Ramon Cepero stadium, where Ciego de Avila beat Mayabeque 3-0 to put the match 2-1 in their favor.

Luis Marrero opened for the Tigres de Yorelvis Charles and threw 7.2 innings with three singles and five strikeouts, while reliever Yosvany Ávalos retired three of the four batters he faced to earn his eleventh save of the tournament.

Raul Gonzalez, who hit 4-2 and towed two of the three runs, was the outstanding hitter for the Avileños.

And Sancti Spíritus managed to tie 2-2 the match against Pinar del Río by winning today 11-6 the game sealed by rain. It was the eleventh victory in the tournament for right-hander Yuen Socarrás, who has on his record the two wins
