Havana, December 22 (RHC)-- Cuba's Ariel Martinez thanked on Wednesday the possibility of representing his country again in the Japanese Professional Baseball League, whose next season will welcome him from the ranks of the Hokkaido Nippon-Ham Fighters (Luchadores).

"I feel happy and honored for this new challenge, after five years with another team," said the former Chunichi Dragons member after making his contract with his new franchise official.
