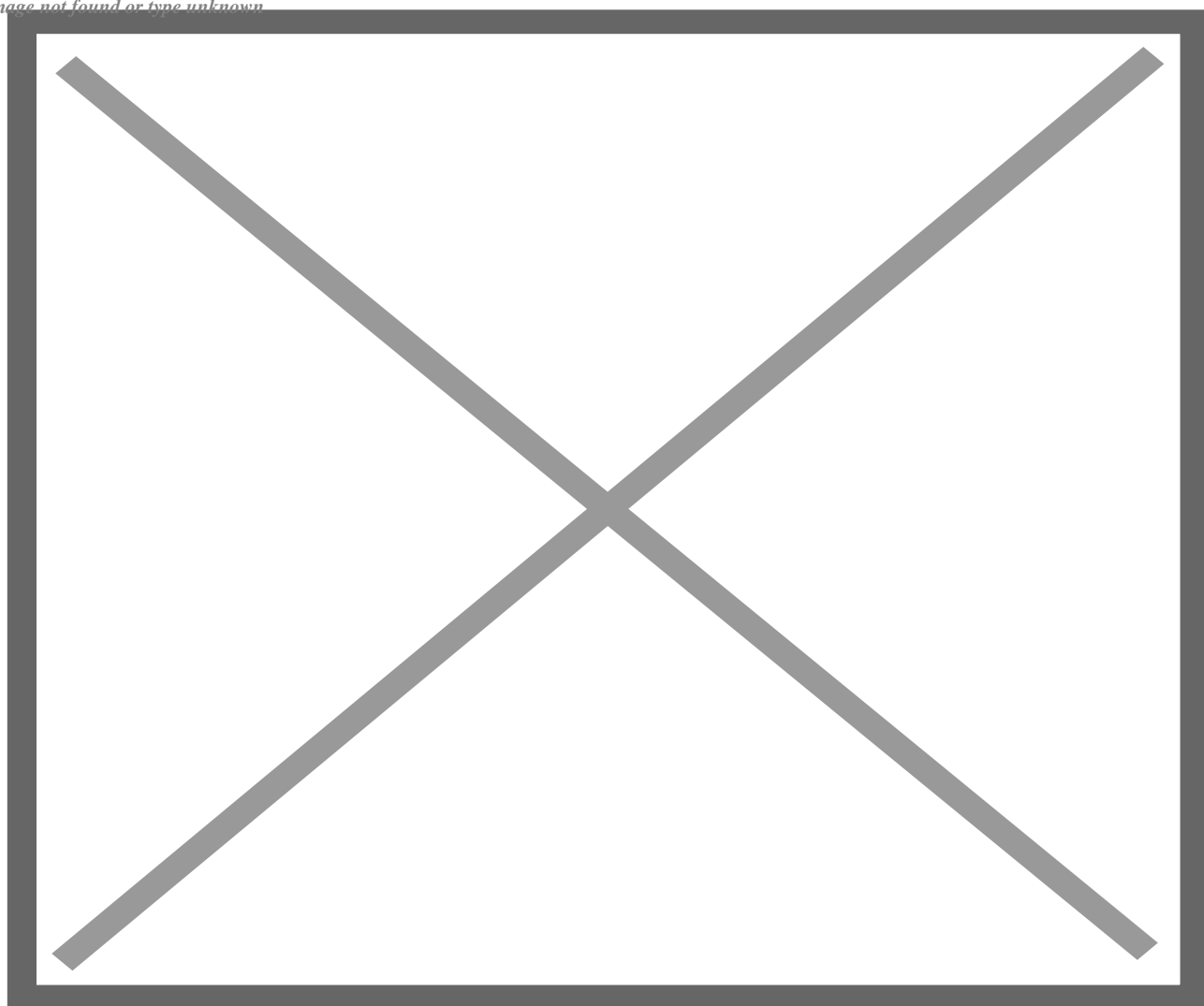

Havana, December 24 (RHC)-- INDER President Osvaldo Vento Montiller led the award ceremony of the José González Barros 2022 National Sports Journalism Contest on Friday.
