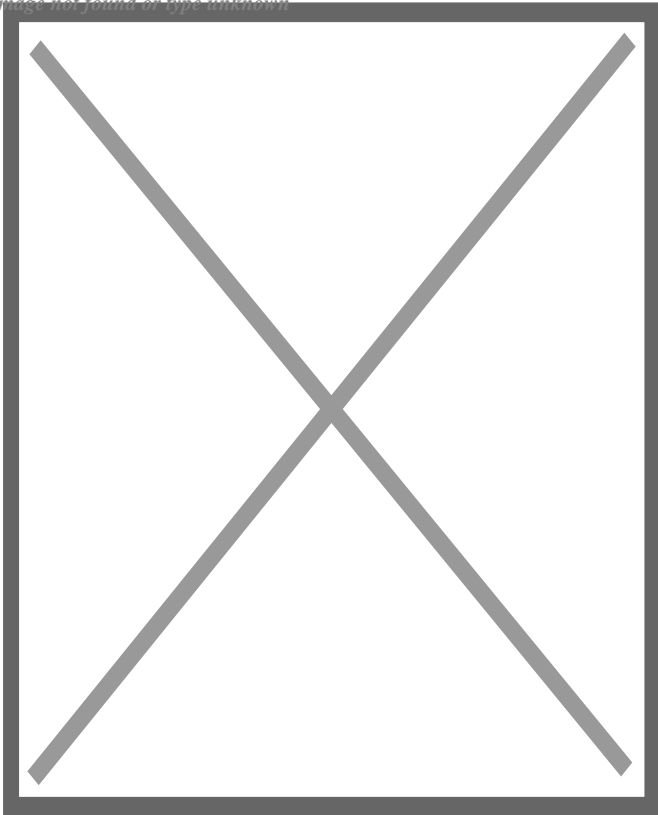


Vice presidents of the Institute of Information and Communications appointed
