

Germany makes history in basketball World Cup



Havana, September 11 (PL) -- The German national team made history on Sunday by winning its first title in a basketball world championship, after defeating Serbia 83-77, with a great performance by point guard Denis Schroder.

The former Los Angeles Lakers player, now Toronto Raptors, scored 28 points and led the German attack accompanied by Franz Wagner (Orlando Magic), who contributed 19.

For Serbia, it is the second final loss in the last three World Championships despite the performance of Aleksa Avramovic (21) and Bogdan Bogdanovic (19).

In the duel for the bronze medal, Canada also caused a surprise by knocking the United States off the podium with a 127-118 victory in a thrilling match that went to overtime.

For the Canadians, the contribution of Dilon Brooks, who scored 39 points, and Shai Gilgeous-Alexander, who scored 31, were decisive.
