
Raúl and Díaz-Canel send floral offerings to José Martí's tomb

Havana, January 28 (RHC)-- Army General Raúl Castro Ruz and the first secretary of the Central Committee of the Communist Party of Cuba (CC-PCC) and president of the Republic, Miguel Díaz-Canel sent floral offerings to the tomb where the remains of Cuban independence fighter José Martí (1853-1895) rest, on Sunday, on the 171st anniversary of his birth.

A group of people from Santiago de Cuba, workers, members of the Association of Combatants of the Cuban Revolution and the Revolutionary Armed Forces arrived at the Santa Ifigenia necropolis in Santiago de Cuba to honor the memory of the National Hero.
