Cuba's First Vice President Stresses Role of Island's Cultural Institutions



Havana, October 1 (RHC)-- Cuban First Vice President Miguel Diaz-Canel stressed the need to empower the island's cultural institutions, during a meeting with executives of the Cuban Artists and Writers' Association, UNEAC.
