
Rose Mary Almanza gets a ticket to Paris by leading Cuban athletics in Forbach

Havana, May 27 (RHC) - Cuba's Rose Mary Almanza achieved a ticket for the Paris 2024 Olympic event on Sunday, by winning the 800m with 1:58.89 minutes at the athletics meeting based in Forbach, France.

With that result, Almanza achieved her best mark of the season and a place to participate in her fourth Olympic Games in Paris.

Nelson Gutiérrez's student and world champion with the 4x400 relay in Silesia-2021 had shown her good form, by winning the Cuba Cup two weeks ago in Havana, with 1.59.62 min, close to the Olympic qualification mark (1.59.30).

In the same 800m test in Forbach, the young Daily Cooper (22 years old) once again broke below the 2.00.00 min barrier, and once again showed potential to qualify for the Olympic event.

The Olympic 400m finalist, Roxana Gómez, already qualified for Paris, performed one of her best races in recent times and won with 50.84 seconds (s), while the reappeared Yoandys Lescay won the same test in sex male (46.33=.

Sprinters Shainer Reginfo and Reynaldo Espinosa fell below expectations in the 100m. Reginfo was second with 10.36, and Espinosa fourth with 10.58.
