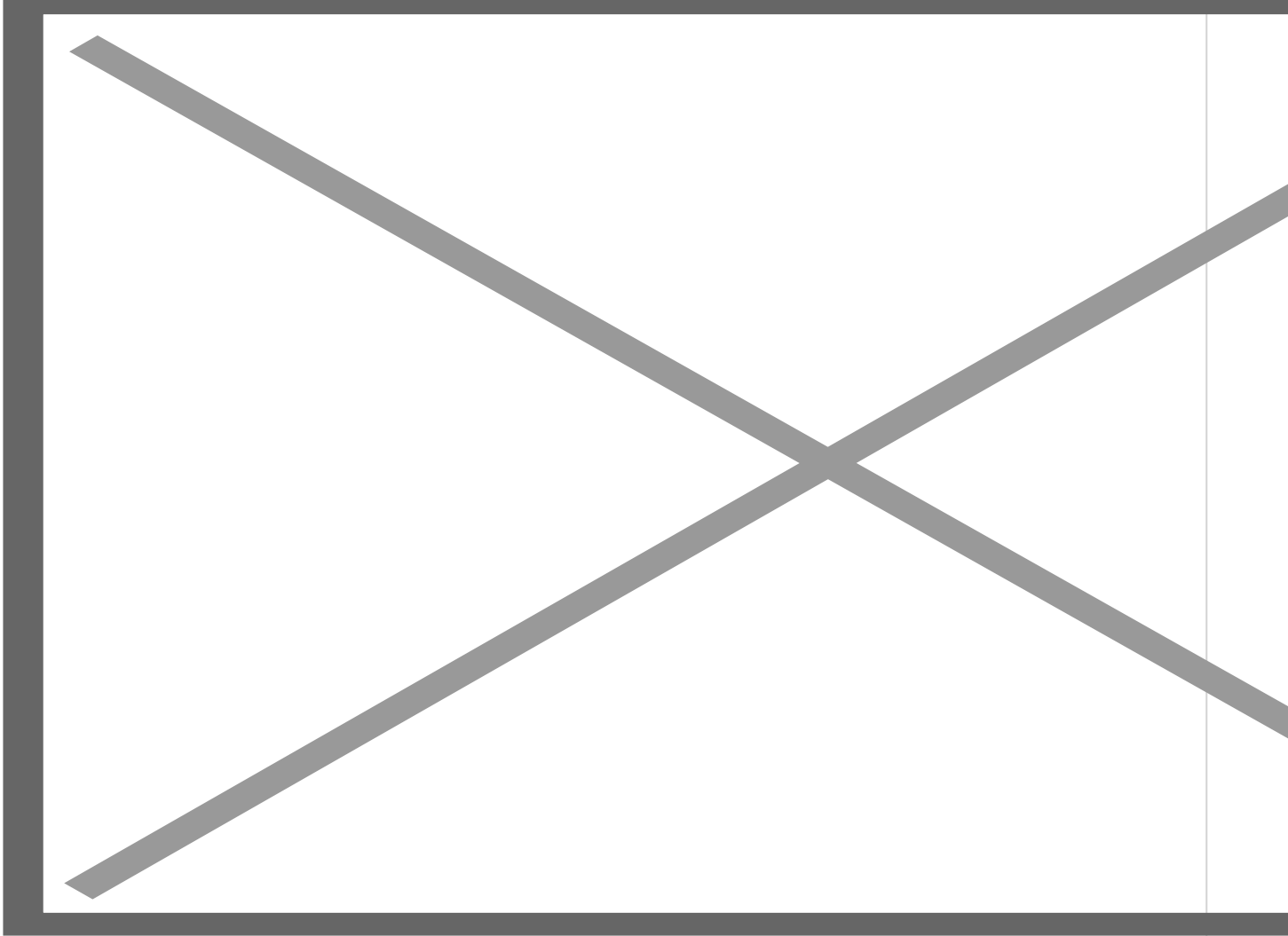


Armed Peace
