
President of Venezuela announces new round of talks with the U.S. government



Caracas, July 2 (RHC)-- "I want a future for our relations under the absolute sovereignty and independence of Venezuela," said Nicolás Maduro.

The president of Venezuela, Nicolás Maduro, reported this Monday on his program Con Maduro+ that talks with the Government of the United States will restart on Wednesday.

"I have received the proposal from the United States Government to reestablish talks and direct dialogue," said Nicolás Maduro when accepting this proposal so that "they comply with the agreements signed in Qatar and to reestablish the terms of dialogue with respect and without manipulation."

Massive participation of the people in simulation ahead of the July 28 elections in Venezuela stands out At the same time, the president affirmed that he is a man of dialogue and believes that through this Venezuela is respected and democracy upheld, and he is committed to these conversations being public.

By specifying that "they there know who is going to win the presidential elections," the head of state indicated that he wants to overcome this conflict of brutal and sterile confrontation.

"It is up to them to comply," said Maduro, while he announced that he will be head of the National Dialogue Commission Jorge Rodríguez and the governor of the state of Miranda, Héctor Rodríguez Castro.

"I want a future for our relations, I want change under the absolute sovereignty and independence of Venezuela," he reaffirmed.

Venezuelan president highlights massive participation in electoral simulation: "how a people governs"

Likewise, Nicolás Maduro in his program welcomed the massive participation in the electoral simulation held on Sunday, June 30 in the country.

"Yesterday we won twice, we won by a landslide, first during the day, this beautiful town came out for the drill and the biggest drill in history took place," said the head of state, while noting that then "the boys from La Vinotinto came." and they won 3 to 0", referring to the match that occurred.

The president stated that "it was a party," while he recognized the experience as splendid. Likewise, he thanked the National Electoral Council, all its authorities, the personnel involved, table members, the anonymous heroes and heroines and the observers.

In recognizing the mobilization of the Venezuelan people, Nicolás Maduro pointed out that he found in Sunday's "the faith of a people that they could not defeat neither with guarimbas, nor with sanctions, nor with threats, nor with hatred," the dignitary insisted, while He stressed that "they could not and will not be able to defeat the faith of our people."

By betting on faith, Maduro said that we are achieving the great changes that Venezuela wants. "We do not promise, we have produced the changes that Venezuela needs. "We are not a promise, we are facts," he said.

"We are writing a new history. I see a greening of hope. Hope is in the street. This electoral campaign is going to be a campaign of justice, of peace, of truth," he stated.
