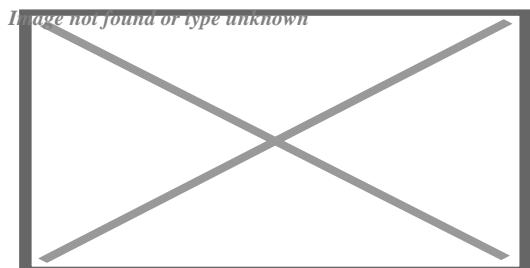

Havana, Sep 9 (RHC) The delegation that represented Cuba at the Paris 2024 Paralympic Games will return to the homeland on Monday night, after a performance that once again has aroused admiration and affection in our people, led by the eleven-time star of these events, Omara Durand.
