Young Cuban writers presented with Calendario awards



The Calendario Awards for 2017 were presented to young Cuban writers this week at Havana's International Book Fair.

More than one hundred works competed in different categories, such as narrative, poetry, science fiction and others in what is considered one of the country's most prestigious literary competitions.
