

Cuban State Security Marks 55th Anniversary



Havana, March 26 (RHC) The Cuban State Security Organs marked their 55th anniversary fully involved in fighting crime and supporting activities in keeping with the ongoing economic and social transformations in the country.

A letter by Interior Minister Abelardoo Colome, was read at a ceremony held at Havana's Karl Marx Theater by Osvaldo Hernandez, a representative of the Cuban Counter-intelligence General Direction.
