

Nordic solidarity brigade arrives in Cuba



Havana, December 18 (RHC)-- Noemi Rabaza Fernandez, First Vice President of the Cuban Friendship Institute (ICAP), says that the island is working harder every day to build prosperous and sustainable socialism, during the welcoming ceremony of the Nordic Brigade of Solidarity with Cuba.

Rabaza delivered the welcoming words to the members of the 63rd group, which took place at the Julio Antonio Mella International Camp (CIJAM), in Caimito municipality, Artemisa.

She denounced that the United States is tightening the economic, commercial, and financial blockade against Cuba in its repeated attempt to hinder at any price the development and welfare of its people.
