Cuban artist pays tribute to Alicia Alonso on her 124th birthday anniversary



The exhibition 'Mi amiga Alicia,' by Cuban artist Nelson Domínguez, was inaugurated over the weekend in central Santa Clara province.

On display at the art gallery of the Association of Artists and Writers (UNEAC) in the province, the traveling exhibition pays homage to Cuban prima ballerina assoluta, Alicia Alonso on occasion of her 100th birthday anniversary on December 21st this year.
