

# *Contradictions and uncertainty in the United States*

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With only one month to go before the U.S. presidential elections -- when the House of Representatives and one-third of the Senate will also be up for grabs -- surprises still arise from the current race for the presidency in the United States. ABC and CNN said Trump received supplemental oxygen on Friday before being transferred to a hospital. As we can see, there is a set of versions that makes it difficult to guess what is really happening.

The truth is that in the worst possible way, the current resident of the White House is discovering the tremendous irresponsibility of minimizing a dangerous pandemic, as well as denying the importance of individual means of protection, such as wearing a mask and maintaining social distancing.
