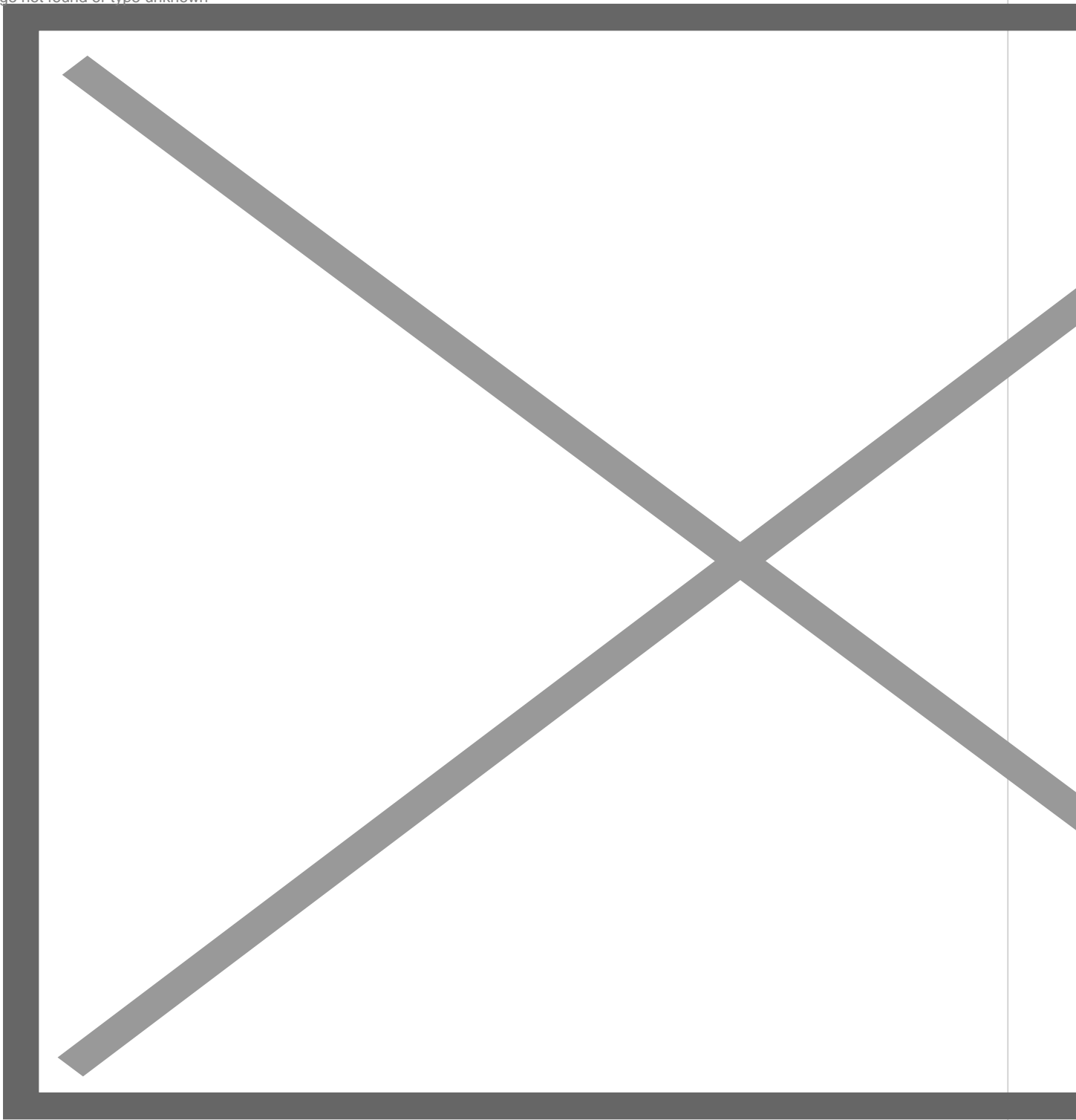


Cuba and Japan strengthen sports cooperation ties
