The event was propitious to present cultural exhibitions where the traditions and customs of the countries of Southeast Asia and Venezuela were exhibited, in addition to gastronomic tastings. Diplomats and representatives of various ministries stressed the importance of this meeting to generate confidence and attract investments based on cooperative relations based on mutual respect.

Also participating for Venezuela were authorities from the Ministries of Housing and Habitat; Tourism; Economy, Finance and Foreign Trade; Industries and National Production; Housing and Habitat; the Foreign Trade Bank (Bancoex) and the Institute for Socialist Training and Education (Inces).
