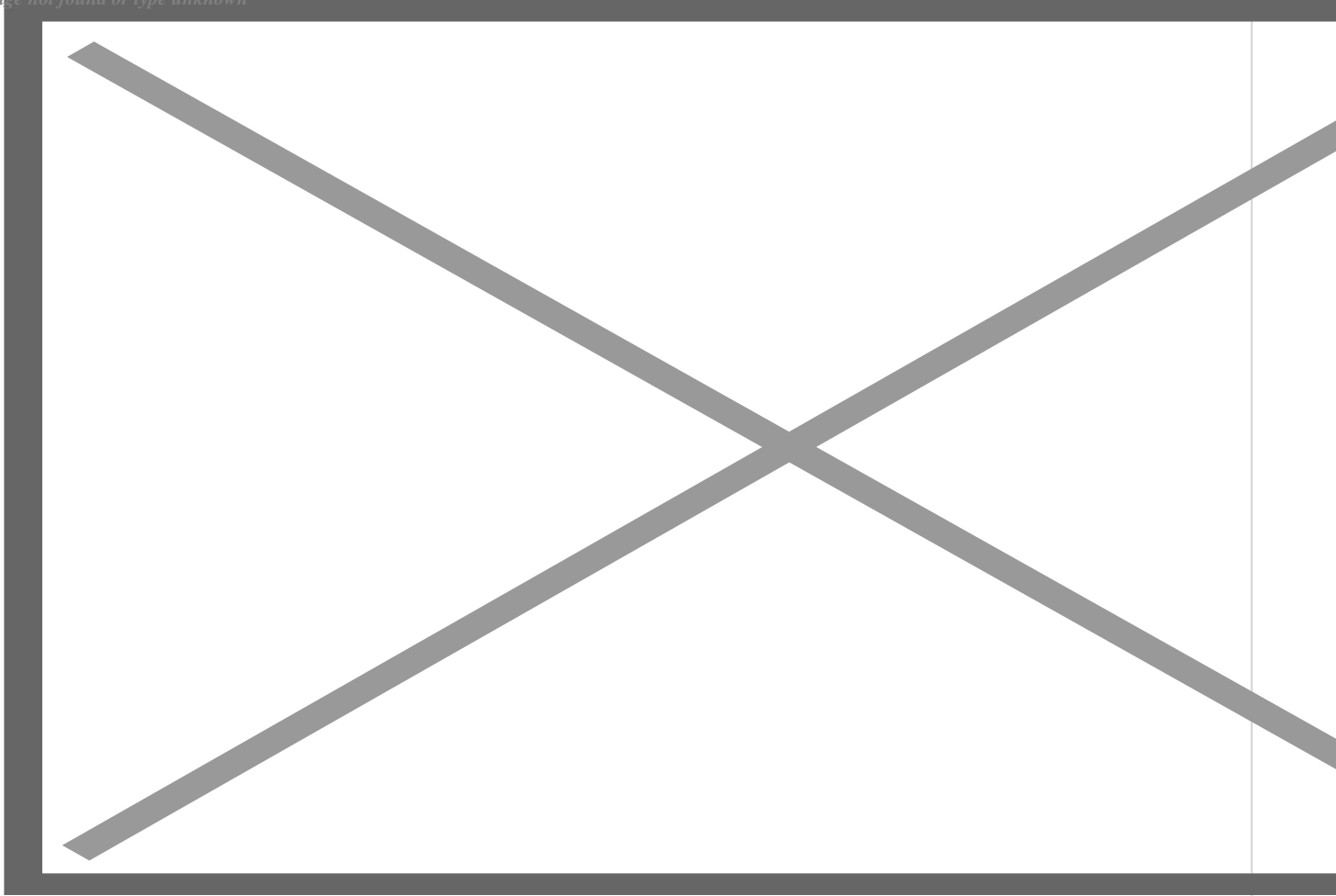


COVID-19 continues to wreak havoc in English soccer league
