

Kenya to start booster shot drive amid virus fears

Kenya will offer COVID-19 booster shots to individuals six months after their initial shots, the health ministry said in a document published a day after the country logged its highest rate of positive COVID-19 tests.

Nairobi, December 27 (RHC)-- Kenya will offer COVID-19 booster shots to individuals six months after their initial shots, the health ministry said in a document published a day after the country logged its highest rate of positive COVID-19 tests.

Kenya last month said it would demand proof of vaccination to access public spaces and transport from December 21. The move met with a combination of bemusement, dismissal and occasional spot

enforcement, given the country's low vaccination rate.

By Friday, just over 14 percent of Kenyan adults had been fully vaccinated.
