

Venezuela and Honduras reestablish diplomatic relations

Tegucigalpa, January 28 (RHC)-- Venezuelan Foreign Minister Felix Plasencia announced on Thursday the reestablishment of diplomatic relations between his country and Honduras, after the arrival of Xiomara Castro to the presidency of the Central American country.

Plasencia highlighted the triumph of the Honduran people and the commitment of Venezuelan President Nicolás Maduro to consolidate Latin American and Caribbean brotherhood. At the end of the inauguration ceremony, the new Honduran president and the Venezuelan foreign minister held the first bilateral

meeting to discuss issues of common interest.
