President Raul Castro Presides over Swearing-in Ceremony of 32 Cuban Ambassadors



Havana, July 16 (ACN-RHC) -- Cuban President Raul Castro headed the swearing-in ceremony on Tuesday of 32 new Cuban ambassadors to Africa, the Caribbean, Asia, the Middle East and international organizations.
