

Journalist Ignacio Ramonet Granted Honorary Membership in Cuban Artists Association



Havana, July 30 (RHC) — French-Spanish journalist Ignacio Ramonet was granted the distinction of Member of Honor of the Association of Cuban Artists and Writers (UNEAC) on Tuesday.

UNEAC president Miguel Barnet bestowed the distinction upon Ramonet during a ceremony in Havana, in which he said that the recognition entails a sincere tribute to a friend who has always defended noble and fair causes.
