Cuban Political Leader Stresses Work of Doctors in Venezuela



Miranda, July 31 (RHC) — Communist Party Central Committee member and head of its International Relations Department, Jose Ramon Balaguer, told a group of Cuban doctors that they should feel satisfied for their contribution to the consolidation of the Bolivarian Revolution.
