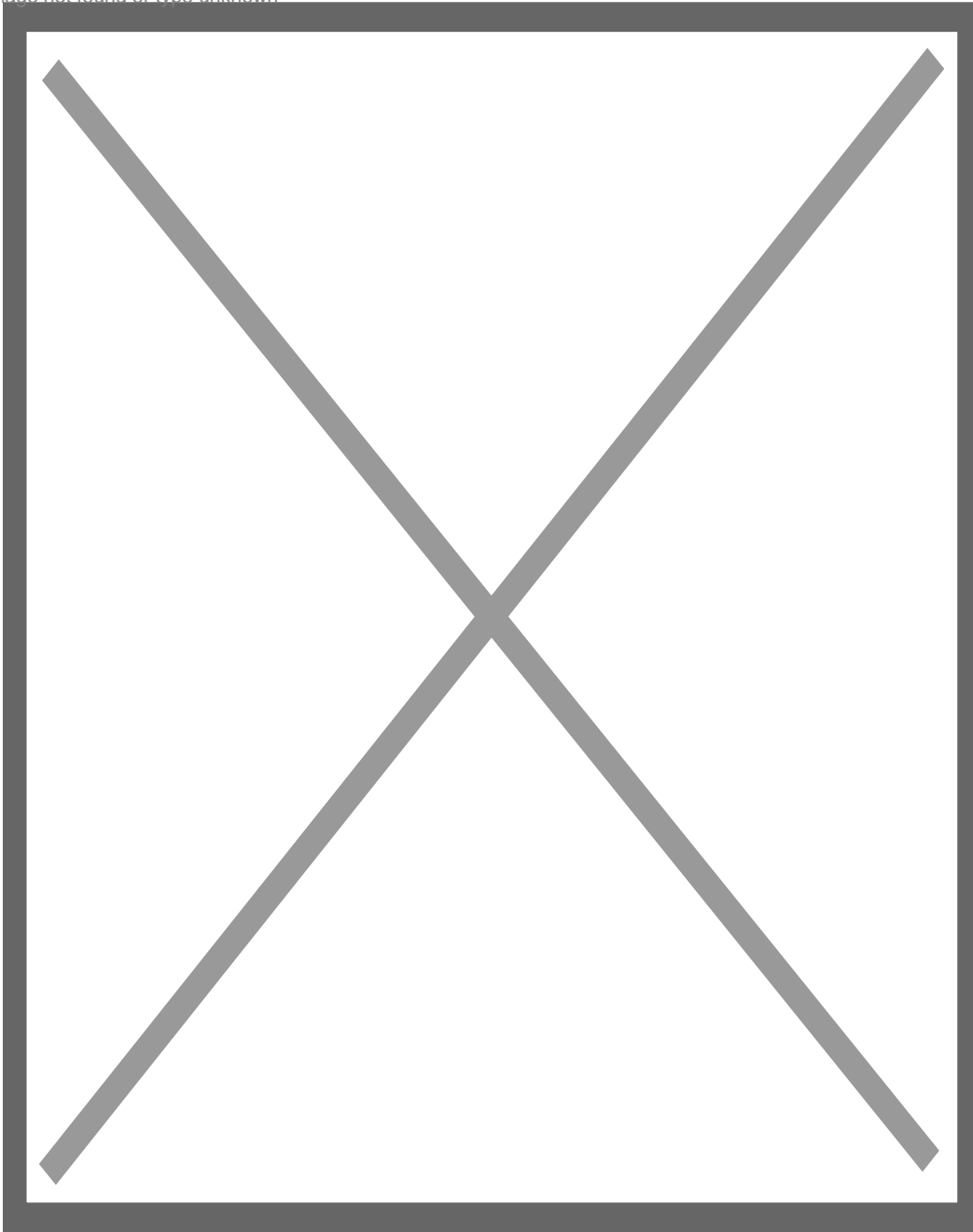


*President Díaz-Canel
