

Robert Kennedy Jr. says an enormous debt is owed to Julian Assange

New York, August 28 (RHC)-- In the U.S., Robert F. Kennedy Jr. -- the son of Robert Kennedy and nephew of former U.S. President John F. Kennedy -- took to X, formerly Twitter, to express his gratitude towards WikiLeaks founder Julian Assange for exposing the U.S. government's controversial efforts related to Monsanto's Roundup.

Kennedy, a Democratic presidential candidate, highlighted the significant role Assange played in revealing the U.S. government's alleged corrupt practices in promoting Monsanto's toxic Roundup globally. He emphasized the debt environmentalists owe to Assange for his fearless revelations.
