
Namibian president receives president of the Cuban Parliament



Havana, February 25 (RHC) -- Namibian President Nangolo Mbumba received this Sunday in Windhoek the president of the National Assembly of People's Power of Cuba (Parliament), Esteban Lazo Hernández, at the State House of that African nation.
