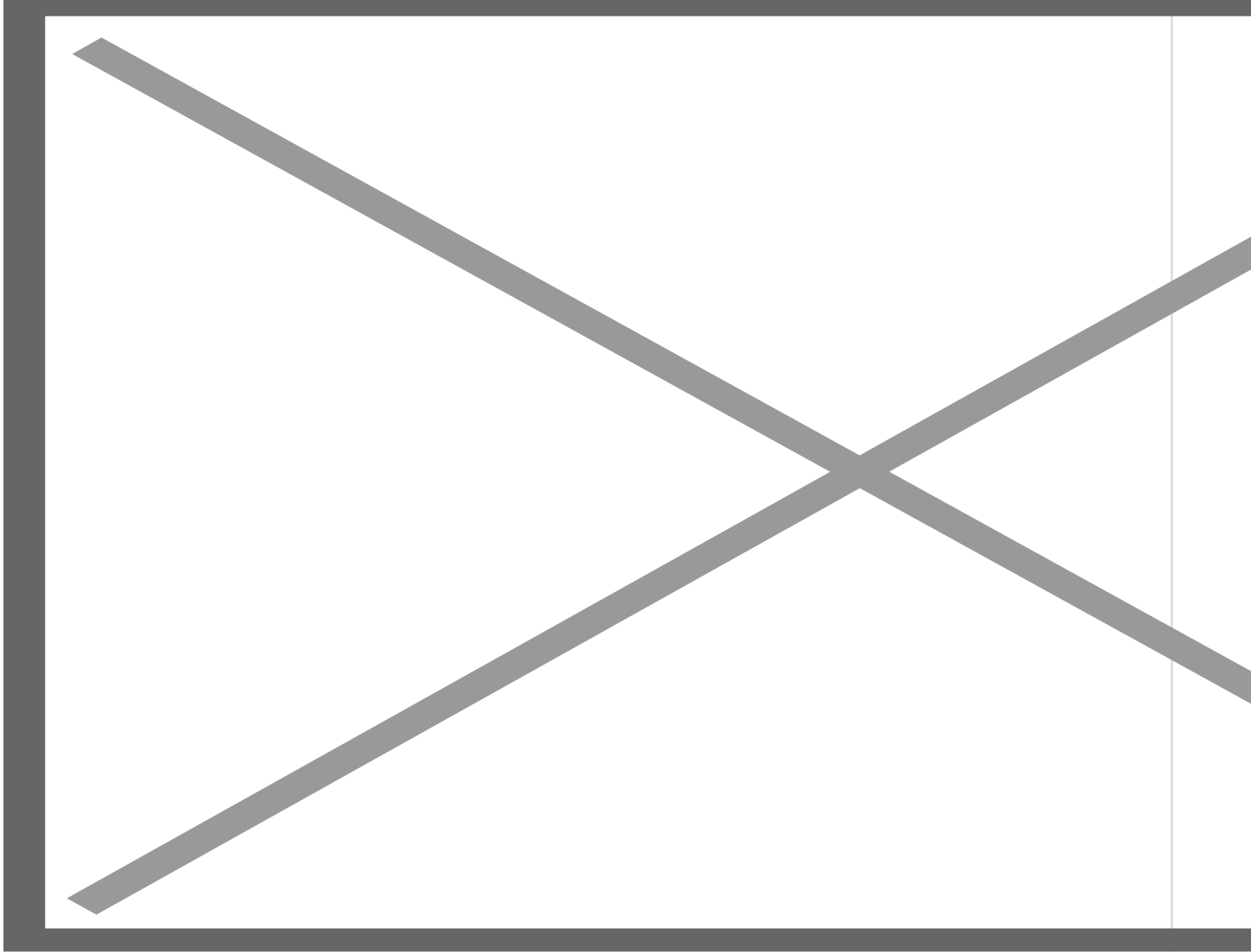


MIT enrollment of Black students plummets after U.S. Supreme Court affirmative action ruling

Cambridge, August 24 (RHC)-- In the U.S., the incoming freshman class at MIT, the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, has a significantly smaller share of Black students following last year's Supreme Court decision striking down affirmative action in college admissions.

The class of 2028 is just 5% Black, versus 13% in prior years. The percentage of Latino students fell from 15% to 11%. MIT President Sally Kornbluth said: "[W]e expected the ruling to pose a serious challenge to sustaining ... the diverse mix of students who make MIT the place it is today. Now that the Class of 2028 has enrolled, the impact is clear, and it is concerning."
