Tobacco Growers in Western Cuba Expand Plantations



Pinar del Rio, October 16 (RHC) -- Tobacco planting in western Pinar del Rio will use over 15,900 hectares of land for the 2014-2015 campaign, 115 hectares more than last year, when the local production was well behind schedule particularly due to bad weather.

Tobacco leaf production in Pinar del Rio, the Cuban province considered as the cradle of tobacco, mostly lies on the shoulders of private farmers and cooperatives, who contribute over 90 percent of the national production.
