Cuban Young Communist League Prepares for Congress



Havana, January 15 (RHC-PL) — The issues that have been discussed to be included in the agenda for the 10th Congress of the Young Communist League in Cuba (UJC) are as rich as the country's thinking, stated First Secretary of the UJC, Yuniaski Crespo.
