Brazil's Lula Da Silva Urges Washington to End Blockade of Cuba



Sao Paulo, April 15 (RHC) — Former Brazilian President Luiz Inacio Lula Da Silva on Tuesday hailed the decision by U.S. President Barack Obama to take Cuba off the list of state sponsors of terrorism, and urged Washington to lift the economic blockade against Cuba.
