

Cuban First Vice President Says Nicaragua is Sister Nation



Managua, July 20 (RHC) -- Cuban First Vice President Miguel Diaz-Canel said in Managua that the people of Nicaragua have been brothers and sisters of Cuba as there are many chapters in history uniting both nations.

Diaz-Canel, who headed the Cuban delegation to celebrations in Nicaragua for the 36th anniversary of the Popular Sandinista Revolution, said that Nicaragua has always backed Cuba's struggle against the U.S. economic, commercial and financial blockade and played a very active role in the fight for the release of the five Cuban anti-terrorist fighters who were held for over 16 years in U.S. prisons.

The two countries support each other at international forums and are fully integrated into the Community of Latin American and Caribbean States, the Bolivarian Alliance for the Peoples of Our Americas and the PetroCaribe energy program.
