
Sinn Fein's Gerry Adams Says Ireland in Solidarity with Cuba



Havana, October 2 (RHC)-- Gerry Adams, leader of the Irish Sinn Fein Party, stressed the solidarity of Ireland with the Cuban people and expressed his willingness to keep supporting the Cuban revolution with concrete actions.

Adams made his statements during a meeting in Havana on Thursday with Cuban Parliament Vice President Ana Maria Machado.

The Cuban official thanked Adams and his party delegation for the gesture of solidarity they have shown towards our country, particularly their support of the cause of the five Cuban anti-terrorist fighters who served unfair prisons sentences in U.S. jails and their backing of the island's struggle for the lifting of the U.S. economic blockade imposed by Washington for more than 50 years now.
