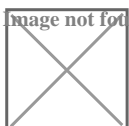


Peruvian Left Holds Primary Elections for Presidential Candidate

Lima, October 6 (teleSUR-RHC)-- On Sunday, for the first time in Peruvian history, the left held primary elections for a presidential candidate.

Opinions at the polls were generally positive and hopeful. Natali Urbina, a member of the left, said she was pleased with the results.

Results are not final but out of the seven candidates, two are in the lead, including the leader of the left, who is also the most popular.

The other candidate vying for the leadership of Frente Amplio is environmentalist and former minister of the environment.
