

Peruvian Left Holds Primary Elections for Presidential Candidate

Lima, October 6 (teleSUR-RHC)-- On Sunday, for the first time in Peruvian history, the left held primary elections for a presidential candidate.

Opinions at the polls were generally positive and hopeful. Natali Urbina, a member of the left, said she was happy to see the results.

Results are not final but out of the seven candidates, two are in the lead, Claudio Montalvo of the left and Carlos Ochoa of the right.

The other candidate vying for the leadership of Frente Amplio is environmentalist and former minister of the Environment, Carlos Ochoa.

Results will be announced on Wednesday but given that the number of people participating was small, the results may be subject to change.
