Cuba and UN Officials Discuss Industrial Property



Geneva, October 16 (RHC-PL) -- Cuban Deputy Minister of Science, Technology and Environment, America Santos, and the director general of the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO), Francis Gurry, held a working meeting in Geneva on Thursday. The exchange took place in the context of the General Assembly of the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO), which was held October 5th to the 14th.

Gurry acknowledged the role played by Cuba in the works of the Organization, and stressed the work of the Cuban Industrial Property Office (CIPO) in the development of the national industrial property system in different sectors of economy and society.

Anayansi Rodriguez, Cuban ambassador at the United Nations Office and other International Organizations in Switzerland; and Maria de los Angeles Sanchez Torres, general director of CIPO, attended the meeting.
