

Former U.S. President Bill Clinton Favors Cuba-U.S. Re-establishment of Diplomatic Relations



Panama City, November 11 (RHC)-- Former U.S. President Bill Clinton has described as positive the re-establishment of diplomatic relations between Washington and Havana.

In statements to Prensa Latina news agency in Panama, Clinton said he considered it something "good" and everyone in this hemisphere "should work together for freedom and prosperity and to take advantage of common opportunities."

The former U.S. president visited the Penonome Laudato Si wind farm in the central Panamanian province of Coclé, 150 kilometers east to the capital Panama City, a renewable energy project considered to be the largest in Central America due to its power output.

The project was supported by the Clinton Foundation on the basis of promoting clean energy, said Rolando Gonzalez, who heads Inter-Energy Holdings, the main investor at the plant.

Clinton said that Cuba can do as Panama is doing and stop importing energy, since it only needs investment, something that favors future economic relations with the United States.
